Nutrient Management Farmer Education grant

Completion of the NMFE grant included a summary of participation and expenses to be reimbursed by the WI Dept. of Agriculture Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP). In March of 2017, 15 participants attended an initial educational meeting on the topic of nutrient management. The program included discussion of efficient nitrogen management by UW Discovery Farms and managing nutrients in a year of tight profit-margins by UW Soil Scientist Carrie Laboski. Eleven farms then participated in on-farm follow up throughout the growing season of 2017 which included soil sampling, manure nutrient analysis and/or manure wagon calibration, with program grant funds of \$1,710.85. The grant amount requested was \$2,500.00
