2019 Livestock Quiz Bowl and Skillathon

Jackson and Trempealeau Counties had an impressive showing at the state Livestock Quiz Bowl and Skillathon Contests on Saturday, March 2, 2019! In the words of their coach Jessie Oberlin "I am soooooo proud of these kids because they work hard. they have fun, and they are a joy to take anywhere because they are so well mannered."

Jackson County had 18 youth competing: Morgan and Wyatt Berg, Frannie and Sam Everson, Luke Fischer, Doyle Hagen, Grace, Jake and Justin Kling, Austin, Jack and Trent Laufenberg, Morgan Lindow, Kaden Moseley, Austin Olson, Colby Sampson, Brewer Schlifer and Brenna Thorson. We had 3 junior teams and 1 mixed age team competing.

Out of 17 junior teams Jackson County's Junior team #1 (Jack Laufenberg, Jake Kling, Luke Fischer, Doyle Hagen and Austin Olson) placed 3rd in quiz bowl and 2nd in skillathon. Jake was 2nd high individual and Luke was 6th in skillathon. Out of 9 mixed age teams Jackson County's team (Trent Laufenberg, Kaden Moseley, Grace Kling, Wyatt Berg and Austin Laufenberg) placed 2nd in both quiz bowl and skillathon. Grace was 3rd individual, Trent was 5th, Wyatt was 6th and Kaden was 9th in skillathon.

Out of 12 senior teams Trempealeau County's team (Mara Quarne, Blake Johnson, Tyler Johnson and Joie Haines) are the State Champions in both quiz bowl and skillathon. This qualifies them to compete at national contests this fall in Louisville and Nebraska. Individually in skillathon Mara was 2nd and Blake was 6th.

Get 4-H News through Text Messages with Remind

Many school districts already use a free program/app called *Remind* (http://www.remind.com). Jackson County 4-H has been using it too and if you aren't on it yet, we'd love you to join! With *Remind*, schools (in this case, Jackson County 4-H) house classrooms (clubs and project groups) where teachers (4-H leaders and volunteers) can share information with students (4-H members) and their families. Members and families opt in, meaning that they choose which classroom(s) to sign up for.

If you would like to receive text reminders about upcoming 4-H programs and activities, here are the lists that are available now.

To sign up, you can:

- Download the *Remind* app, sign up for an account, and enter the Class Code to join.
- Or just text to "81010" with "Class Code" in the message.

Make sure to check with your club, project or other group leader about whether they will be starting a "class." Or you might be more comfortable with the technology and could consider volunteering to take the lead.

Remind will not replace all other forms of communication. Here's the plan:

- Newsletters quarterly
- · Bi-Weekly emails will continue
- Web page Has been revamped and is continued being updated

Remind is one tool in what we believe will be a stronger communication system that reaches more Jackson County 4-H families as well as other community youth interested in our programs. Science Kits Available to Check Out



If you are looking for a STEM focused activity for your club meeting or group, there are Science kits available to check out at the Extension Office! 4-H works to connect young people from around the world in an exciting, interactive learning experience in the form of a science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) challenge.

The 2018 kit is called 'Code Your World' and the focus is on computer programming. If you've ever wondered how computer programming works (at the basic level), this year's NYSD challenge is for you! There are four different activities

and generally are geared more for teens, but the activities could be adjusted to work with a variety of ages. Only one of the four activities involves using a computer.

Recipes are Needed for Jackson County 4-H Cookbook!

As one of our fundraisers, 4-H Parents and Leaders Board will be creating and selling a cookbook! The cookbook will be a professionally printed soft cover/spiral bound book.



That's where you come in – current 4-H Members, alumni and their family will contribute all of the recipes!

We are looking at an August deadline to have production completed in time for December delivery.

Not all recipes will be used (there will surely be repeats), so if there

is something special you want included (Best of Show at Fair or Great Grandma's Banana Bread), please indicate that when you submit your recipes and we will do our best. Please submit recipes via email to JC4Hcookbook@gmail.com or drop them off at the extension off labeled "cookbook."

Volunteers will be typing the recipes in the proper format to reduce the overall cost of the printing. To keep the production price low, recipes MUST have single instructions (e.g. cannot have several parts to them - icing, then filling, then cake instructions - must be written as one process), so please take that into consideration when choosing your recipes.

It is important to do this as soon as possible - if you can, do not wait until August to submit the recipes so the team has time to get them all done! If you cannot submit recipes via email, please use the attached form and submit the recipes on paper on or before August. Please us a format similar to the hard copy form when providing the typed recipes via email.

We will be taking pre-orders. More information will be sent out later.

If all goes as planned, we will submit the order the end of August and should have the books back just after Thanksgiving, BUT THIS CAN ONLY HAPPEN IF YOU GET YOUR RECIPES IN ON TIME, so please make it happen!

Becoming a 4-H Volunteer

4-H Volunteers are valued partners in working with our youth and help make 4-H possible. In order to volunteer, previous 4-H Youth Development experience is not necessary. The most important qualification is a desire to work with young people and help them grow through educational experiences and gain positive life skills. Please consider sharing your time and talents! Adult volunteers working together with youth make a difference in the lives of young people.

Volunteers work with UW-Extension professionals to develop the life skills of youth members, thus benefiting the state, employers, and the economy. Volunteers extend the resources of UW-Extension as they work with staff to deliver educational programs. Volunteering is a privilege. How does one become a volunteer? If you have not already done so, go to Wisconsin 4HOnline and create a family profile.

If your family is already in the system, do not create a new family profile, just make sure you are entered into your family account and check that you want to be a 4-H volunteer. Then sign-up to take the Online Mandated Reporter Training for 4-H Volunteers. After signing up for the Online Mandated Reporter Training call the Jackson County UW-Extension office at 715-284-4257 or email sarah.tanis@wisc.edu to set a time for your Volunteer In Preparation (VIP) training. Once you've completed your Online Mandatory Reporter training and VIP training, a background check will be conducted on you by the state and you will be contacted by GIS through e-mail requesting additional information needed in order for the state to conduct the background check.

Board Representatives Reminder

Representatives from each 4-H Club are needed at bimonthly Parents & Leaders Association Executive Board meetings – January, March, May, July, and September. The Board meets on the 3rd Monday of these months at 5:30PM at the UW-Extension office. Representation is important to ensure that business can be taken care of and so information can travel back and forth between clubs and the Board. Youth and adult representatives welcome.


Registration fees are \$10 for 4-H members and \$15 for non-4-H friends.



Wisconsin 4-H & Youth Conference is an opportunity for youth in 7-10th grades to participate in a wide variety of assemblies, seminars, and service projects meant to provide a pre-college experience that will focus on personal development, broadening of interests, and developing new skills. This year's WI 4-H & Youth Conference will be held June 24-27, 2019 on the UW Madison Campus.
