Watch your Chicks and Chickens!

This year has been terrible for gnats. Please watch your chicks and chickens that are not free range. The black gnats are extremely bad this year, and birds can not get away from them because they are caged, you will need to use netting the gnats cannot get through, or some sort of bug spray/repellent to keep them at bay or they will swarm your chickens and bleed them out.

Some other suggestions that may help:

- Put some apple cider vinegar in the drinking water as this is supposed to help
- Using a spray of lemon grass essential oil in water to lightly mist the area and chickens with. It works well to keep the bugs away.

Becoming a 4-H Volunteer

4-H Volunteers are valued partners in working with our youth and help make 4-H possible. In order to volunteer, previous 4-H Youth Development experience is not necessary. The most important qualification is a desire to work with young people and help them grow through educational experiences and gain positive life skills. Please consider sharing your time and talents! Adult volunteers working together with youth make a difference in the lives of young people.

Volunteers work with UW-Extension professionals to develop the life skills of youth members, thus benefiting the state, employers, and the economy. Volunteers extend the resources of UW-Extension as they work with staff to deliver educational programs. Volunteering is a privilege. How does one become a volunteer? If you have not already done so, go to Wisconsin 4HOnline and create a family profile.

If your family is already in the system, do not create a new family profile, just make sure you are entered into your family account and check that you want to be a 4-H volunteer. Then sign-up to take the Online Mandated Reporter Training for 4-H Volunteers. After signing up for the Online Mandated Reporter Training call the Jackson County UW-Extension office at 715-284-4257 or email sarah.tanis@wisc.edu to set a time for your Volunteer In Preparation (VIP) training. Once you've completed your Online Mandatory Reporter training and VIP training, a background check will be conducted on you by the state and you will be contacted by GIS through e-mail requesting additional information needed in order for the state to conduct the background check.

Issues in 4-H & the Care to Share Form

Sometimes issues or concerns come up in Jackson County 4-H. That's why we have the Care to Share form.

Care to Share (located at <https://jackson.extension.wisc.edu/4-h/for-members-and-parents/forms-and-applications/>) offers Jackson County 4-Hers to describe the issue, explain why it's a problem, suggest a solution and submit it for consideration. All completed forms must include a possible solution AND a member, leader or parent signature. Forms are submitted to the Jackson County Extension Office who then forwards it to the appropriate group or committee for consideration.

Record Books

We are excited that Record Books are right around the corner! We have many options on how to make a 4-H record book, so choose what fits your style to share what your 4-H story has been over the course of this past year.

We recognize that there are different ways that youth like to do things and that there are different ways to put together a Record Book that will best represent the youth and their experience in the 4-H program that year. Also, it should be noted that you can still do the 'Traditional Record Book' as well if you'd like to—that option has not gone away!

 - Interested youth should submit their resume and cover letter to the Extension Office by September 13, 2019.

FAIR ANNOUNCEMENTS

Wisconsin Waiver for Pullorum Testing for Poultry at Fair: Update

The law requiring pullorum testing for "persons who use poultry or farm-raised game birds or their eggs for breeding or hatching or for the exhibition at a fair or livestock exhibition" has been waived as of April 22, 2019. The waiver will remain until it is determined that pullorum antigen is sufficiently available. It is unclear when that date may be.



All 4-H members received an email about poultry testing a few weeks ago, this is an update since that email. This update is from the State of Wisconsin.

What this means: Poultry can be shown at the fair without testing this year—at least until new antigen becomes available. Notification will be sent if more antigen has become available and if it is needed to be shown at fair this year.

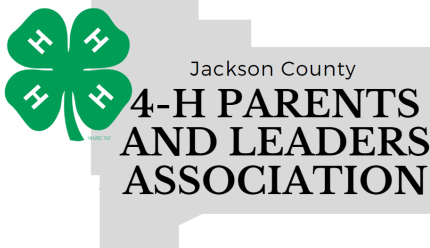
