- Updated Shooting Sports Certification Process: Recently, Shooting Sports certification process has been updated. As noted, we will keep you up-to-date as things evolve in the coming weeks. During these unprecedented times we want to provide you with an update on the status of the 2020 Wisconsin State Fair and say THANK YOU. We hear every word of support and encouragement you have sent, and this fuels us to keep working to ensure the Wisconsin State Fair continues its 169-year legacy while keeping safety our top priority. The Wisconsin State Fair is a celebration of everything we are so proud of in Wisconsin, and our priority is to create a place where everyone feels welcome and safe. With this in mind, the State Fair Park Board of Directors and staff continue to discuss options that will enable us to provide this experience in 2020. There are many factors to be considered.
