4-H Projects

4-H engages youth in **project-based** education. Through project learning, youth can dive deeper into their **interests** and **passions**, ultimately **mastering** new skills. 4-H projects are meant to be **hands-on** to create a memorable learning experience.

What is a project?

A project is simply a topic area that **sparks** a youth's interest! Projects can be offered at a club or group setting, or on your own outside of the club. 4-H members are encouraged to enroll in only one or two projects for their first year. 4-H members in 3rd grade and higher are eligible to sign up for any 4-H project. Almost all 4-H projects can be divided into these nine broad project areas:

- Animal Sciences
- Arts & Communication
- Community Involvement
- Cultural Projects
- Family, Home, & Health
- Outdoor Education (Natural Sciences)
- Plant & Soil Sciences
- Extension and O

What resources are available?

Each county's 4-H program differs in how project learning opportunities are offered. Some programs offer countywide, short-term workshops. Others may have countywide programs with set dates and meeting locations. Some 4-H clubs may have adults specifically devoted to certain project areas.

What if my county or club doesn't offer a project?

Anywhere can a great place for project learning where a trusted adult or older youth serves as the teacher. Project curriculum is available for many of the projects from shop4-h.org or your local Extension office.

What is a project leader?

Project leaders provide a safe environment to learn about a project area in which they have experience. Adults can volunteer as a project leader to share their specialized skill set with youth!

In Person Meeting Approval Process

As of July 1st 2020 in person meetings are possible! I have a post available on our website that gives you all of the details.

Here is a quick recap of some of the recent updates:

- Guidelines will not change from April 1st 2021-June 30th 2021.
- Pod style meetings can happen outside (with up to 150 people) and no time limit.
- In door meetings can have 50 people or 30% of the room capacity.
- Submitting Approval Forms is now very simple. Use the link to the google form once you submit the form you will get a receipt sent to your email of what you submitted. Your event will be approved instantly and I will get in contact with you if I have any questions.

VIP Training:

VIP or volunteers in preparation training is for anyone who wants to work with youth one-on-one and teach sessions like a project or club leader. If you have signed up to be a volunteer in 4-H Online and I have not approved you yet it might be because of this. Look for this symbol. This means that you will need to complete either VIP or mandated reporter training. Mandated reporter is an online course in 4-H Online that you can complete on your own time. VIP however, has to be taught by either myself or another educator either virtually or in person. This training covers many topics on how to create a safe environment for youth and takes about 90 minutes.

I prefer to do VIP trainings on weeknights in September-April because the rest of the year gets pretty busy for everyone especially in the summer.

Plarn Mat Curriculum:

According to EarthDay.org, about one trillion single-use plastic bags are used every day in the U.S. We've created a service project to put plastic bags to good use and help those in our community who are experiencing homelessness.

Youth involved in the Plarn Mats project will learn how to create plastic yarn (plarn) from bags, and then crochet those bags into mats. The mats will be donated to local organizations.

The full activity plan includes an overview of the whole project as well as separate instructions for different parts of the project:

- Making decisions about your plarn mats project
- Collecting and sorting bags
- Cutting plastic bags into loops
- Making plastic loops into plarn
- Crocheting the plarn mat
- Donating the plarn or plarn mats

Cloverbud Leader:

Jackson County 4-H is looking for a Cloverbud Project Leader! Traditionally this person is an adult who plans Cloverbud project meetings during the year. This year we want to try something different, instead of having one adult be in charge of the whole program we want to encourage multiple youth to teach the program. This would be a great opportunity for an older youth to gain some teaching, leadership, and program planning skills. Here are some of the qualifications of requirements of this position:

- Youth can be 13-19 years of age. Younger youth will need a trusted adult to help them do the program.
- The individual will be in charge or planning the session, getting the description to me and teaching the session.
- The topic is your choice! If you need some help picking a topic I have curriculum you can use to help you plan and teach a session.
- On the day of the program the Youth leader will present their lesson and work with the youth to complete the program.

The number of sessions you teach are up to you! I want to have 4 sessions with this new model to get a good grasp and we will see where to go from there. If this sounds like something you might be interested in please let me know! I want to have Cloverbud programing planned for March-June .
