What is 4-H?

4-H is a community of young people across America, learning leadership, citizenship and life skills.

The four H's stand for Head, Heart, Hands, and Health. The 4-H clover has an H on each of its four leaves to remind members what they are striving for.

In 4-H members "learn by doing". This means members learn through hands on activities they experience through club meetings, project work and by practicing their new skills with caring, certified adult 4-H volunteers and 4-H staff.

How do I join?

Enrollment in 4-H is open to new youth any time of the year. Youth need to be enrolled by April 1st in order to exhibit with their club at the county fair.

Youth and their parents or guardians should contact the 4-H Program Coordinator, Andrea Rippley, at the Jackson County UW -Extension in Black River Falls at (715) 538-3451 or visit jackson.extension.wisc.edu/4-h/

The 4-H educator will speak with you about the program and forward you a list of the club leader contact information. Families are then encouraged to visit several clubs on the list and select the club that best suits their needs. 4-H enrollment forms and instructions will be provided.

4-H is open to all youth grades K-13 or one year past high school graduation. Youth grades K-2 participate in the Cloverbud program which offers age appropriate learning activities and materials. Youth grades 3-13 are able to select from more than 70 project areas to explore!
