Driftless Conservation

Instructor: Eve Kramer Grades: 3-6th Grade Class Size: 10
Students will learn about the natural history of the Driftless Area and what conservation means. They will hear about the facets of conservation and how to practice good land stewardship in their own daily lives. The talk contains short overviews of each facet of conservation: wildlife, water, forestry, and soils. It highlights the importance of each area of conservation as well as some basic techniques we use in our field work. The students will get a broad introduction into the natural resources/conservation profession and get an idea of what it means to be a conservationist.

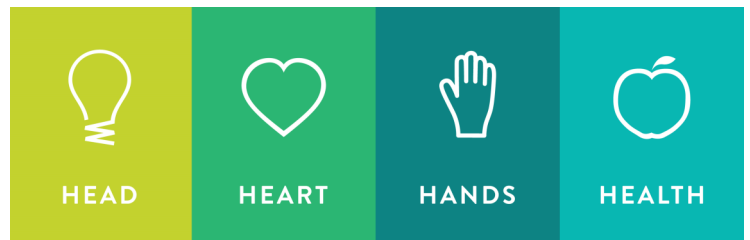
