Avian Flu and the Fair:

The Avian Flu has created challenges for showing poultry (Turkeys, Chickens, etc.) at the fair. The current executive order from the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCAP) states that swaps and shows are canceled until 30 days after the last documented infection. The fair decides on how this will be handled, but I wanted to address the questions that have been asked. Below I have included links to help answer other questions people might have.

VIP Training:

VIP or Volunteers in Preparation training is for anyone who wants to work with youth one-on-one and teach sessions like a project or club leader. If you have signed up to be a volunteer in 4-H Online and I have not approved you yet, it is because of this.

Look for this symbol. This symbol means that you must complete either VIP or mandated reporter training.



The mandated reporter is an online course in 4-H Online that you can complete on your own time. VIP, however, has to be taught by either myself or another educator virtually or in person. This training covers topics like creating a safe environment for youth, insurance, what to do in an emergency, and more. It takes about 90 minutes.

I prefer to do VIP training on weeknights in September-May because the rest of the year gets pretty busy for everyone, especially in the summer.

Dog Project Update:

Your opportunities for Dog Obedience Classes for you and your dog are coming up soon! Dog Obedience Classes will be held in Trempealeau County this Spring. The County 4-H Dog Project Leaders offer the classes for both 4-H Club members enrolled in the dog project and the community members.

The Dog Obedience Informational Class will be held on Monday, May 2, 2022, at 6:00 p.m. in the Whitehall Memorial High School - Commons Area, Whitehall, WI. Enter through the main entrance in the front of the school. The first class is informational only and will include an orientation session, registration (class signup), a demonstration, class information, necessary equipment, and dog health. Do not bring dogs to the first class! CLASS SIZE WILL BE LIMITED – 4-H MEMBERS/YOUTH WILL HAVE PREFERENCE! Attend the May 2nd meeting or call a project leader to reserve your

spot! Enrollment will not be accepted after May 11th, 2022! You may purchase equipment before the first-night training sessions begin.

Weekly training sessions for everyone's convenience will be held in both Whitehall and Galesville. The Whitehall Classes will be held at the old Whitehall Sunset Elementary School Lot (next to the Whitehall High School) and in Galesville at the Fairgrounds. Detailed information will be available at the May 2nd informational session. Whitehall will offer a beginner class, it will be held on Monday evenings starting May 9th at 6:00 p.m. Beginner ,and Advanced Dog Obedience Classes will be held in Galesville. Galesville training classes will begin on Wednesday evening, May 11th, at 6:00 p.m. at the Fairgrounds. Classes will be held weekly through the end of June. (Agility times and dates will be determined after class participant interest is determined) Parental help with setup and takedown of equipment will be required! (You must have completed an obedience class to participate in agility.) Rally and Showmanship will also be offered in Galesville in June (times to be determined). Fair brush up the fun night in Galesville at the Fairgrounds on Wednesday, July 6th, 2022, at 6 pm. The training class fee for 4-H members will be \$25.00, and for non-4-H members (the general public) will be \$60.00.

Equipment needed for the class will be a 6-Ft: leather or cotton web lead and a correctly sized nylon or chain training collar. The cotton web leads can be purchased at class; training collars are also available in all sizes. Anyone participating in agility must have a buckle collar without any tags attached to the collar.

Please bring a copy of your current dog vaccination records with you. (copy to turn in) – we are required to keep a copy. All dogs must have a current distemper, rabies, and parvovirus shots.

Any 4-H member who still wants to enroll in the Dog Project should contact the UW Extension Office in Whitehall at (715) 538-2311 Ext. 208. Remember we have the addition of Dog Obedience Open Class at the Fair so any adults interested can show their dog and participate at the Fair!

4-H Projects

4-H engages youth in **project-based** education. Through project learning, youth can dive deeper into their **interests** and **passions**, ultimately **mastering** new skills. 4-H projects are meant to be **hands-on** to create a memorable learning experience.

What is a **project**?

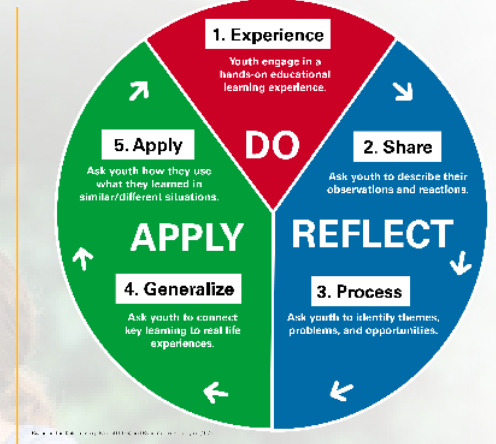
A project is simply a topic area that **sparks** a youth's interest! Projects can be offered at a club or group setting, or on your own outside of the club. 4-H members are encouraged to enroll in only one or two projects for their first year. 4-H members in 3rd grade and higher are eligible to sign up for any 4-H project. Almost all 4-H projects can be divided into these nine broad project areas:

- Animal Sciences
- Arts & Communication
- Community Involvement
- Cultural Projects
- Family, Home, & Health
- Outdoor Education (Natural Sciences)
- Plant & Soil Sciences
- STEM
- Start Your Own

A tenth project area is specifically for grades K-2, known as **Cloverbuds**. It is intended to be more developmentally appropriate for our youngest members.

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What **resources** are available?

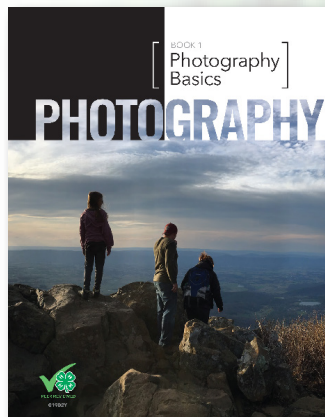
Each county's 4-H program differs in how project learning opportunities are offered. Some programs offer countywide, short-term workshops. Others may have countywide programs with set dates and meeting locations. Some 4-H clubs may have adults specifically devoted to certain project areas.

What if my county or club doesn't offer a project?

Anywhere can be a great place for project learning where a trusted adult or older youth serves as the teacher. Project curriculum is available for many of the projects from shop4-h.org or your local Extension office.

What is a **project leader**?

Project leaders provide a safe environment to learn about a project area in which they have experience. Adults can volunteer as a project leader to share their specialized skill set with youth!
