Charter Updates:

As the 4-H year comes to a close, we are looking at charters and the new 4-H year. Charters are due to the **Extension office on November 1st**. Here is a link to the updated version:

With some new club leaders this year and the updates with the charters, I have one, Charter Workshops, that club leaders can attend. The first one is on **September 22nd, from 6-8 pm at the Jackson County UW Extension Office**. There will not be registered for these workshops, but I will give you time to work on your charter and ask questions.

Another part of the Chartering process is the Annual Financial Report. This summarizes clubs checking and saving accounts for the entire year. These are due to the Extension Office on **September 1st**. There are a couple of critical pieces that need to be included in the annual financial report each year:

1. [Annual Financial Report](#)
2. [Checklist](#)
3. A copy of the bank statement ending on June 30 or July 1st for EACH account.
4. A current inventory of any land, buildings, property, or project equipment with individual values of \$1000 or greater. This is a good way to keep track of things your club has purchased and has a record is.
5. Monthly Treasurers reports for 4-H Clubs or Groups with annual income greater or equal to \$20,000.

VIP Training:

VIP or Volunteers in Preparation training is for anyone who wants to work with youth one-on-one and teach sessions like a project or club leader. If you have signed up to be a volunteer in 4-H Online and I have not approved you yet, it is because of this. You must complete either VIP (inperson Training), mandated reporter training (Online), and Titel IX Training(Online). I am going to shift towards less pre-scheduled VIP trainings and more to working with your schedule. I am also willing to come to club meetings and training adults there! Please contact Andrea if you are interested in scheduling a VIP training!

The mandated reporter is an online course in 4-H Online that you can complete on your own time. VIP, however, has to be taught by either myself or another educator virtually or in person. This training covers topics like creating a safe environment for youth, insurance, what to do in an emergency, and more. It takes about 90 minutes.

I prefer to do VIP training on weeknights in September-May because the rest of the year gets pretty busy for everyone, especially in the summer.

4-H Re-Enrollment:

On September first, 4-H Online will go offline to prepare for the new 4-H year. If you plan to stay enrolled in 4-H for 2022-2023, you can re-enroll on **September 15th**. Enrollment is important! This is how I make mailing lists and out project members list to leaders and contact members. Please make sure to enroll members by **December 1st**. I will keep including members from last year's list until December 1st. After that, you will have to be currently enrolled to be included in any communication.

When reenrolling, please take the time to update any ways you want to receive communication. Here is a list of what I am talking about:

- Email addresses
- Any parent/guardian numbers that should be included.

Parents and guardians do not need to sign up for 4-H Online unless they want to volunteer. If you are in any of the following roles, be sure to re-enroll:

- Club leader
- Project volunteer

A general rule of thumb is that if you have access to club funds (the checkbook) or are planning to work with youth, you should become a certified 4-H volunteer. If you have any questions about this, please contact Andrea.

Wisconsin 4-H Horse Expo:

The Wisconsin State 4-H Horse Expo is an annual event, that is held at the State Fairgrounds in West Allis. This event draws over 900 youth and 700 horses and is open to 4-H members who are in the 6th grade or above. To qualify for the State 4-H Horse Expo, the horse and exhibitor team must have won a blue ribbon in a qualifying class at the county fair.

One member of the horse project made the trip to the Expo on September 16th to compete with her horse. In her first year of eligibility, and by winning a blue in Western Showmanship at this year's fair, Katelyn Hogden and her horse, RY Major Hot Spot aka Bey, were able to move on to state. Katelyn is the daughter of Erik & Rhea Hogden and is a 7th grader at G-E-T Middle School. Katelyn joined the Ettrick Eagles 4-H Club when she was in the 3rd grade and has been showing horses



since she was 4 years old. Katelyn and Bey competed in Hunter Showmanship, Western Showmanship, In Hand Trail and Western Pleasure, placing in the Top 10 in each of her classes. In addition, Katelyn participated in the Horse Judging competition on Friday evening, tying for 12th place out of 26 competitors. Congratulations Katelyn, what a great first State Expo for you and Bey!

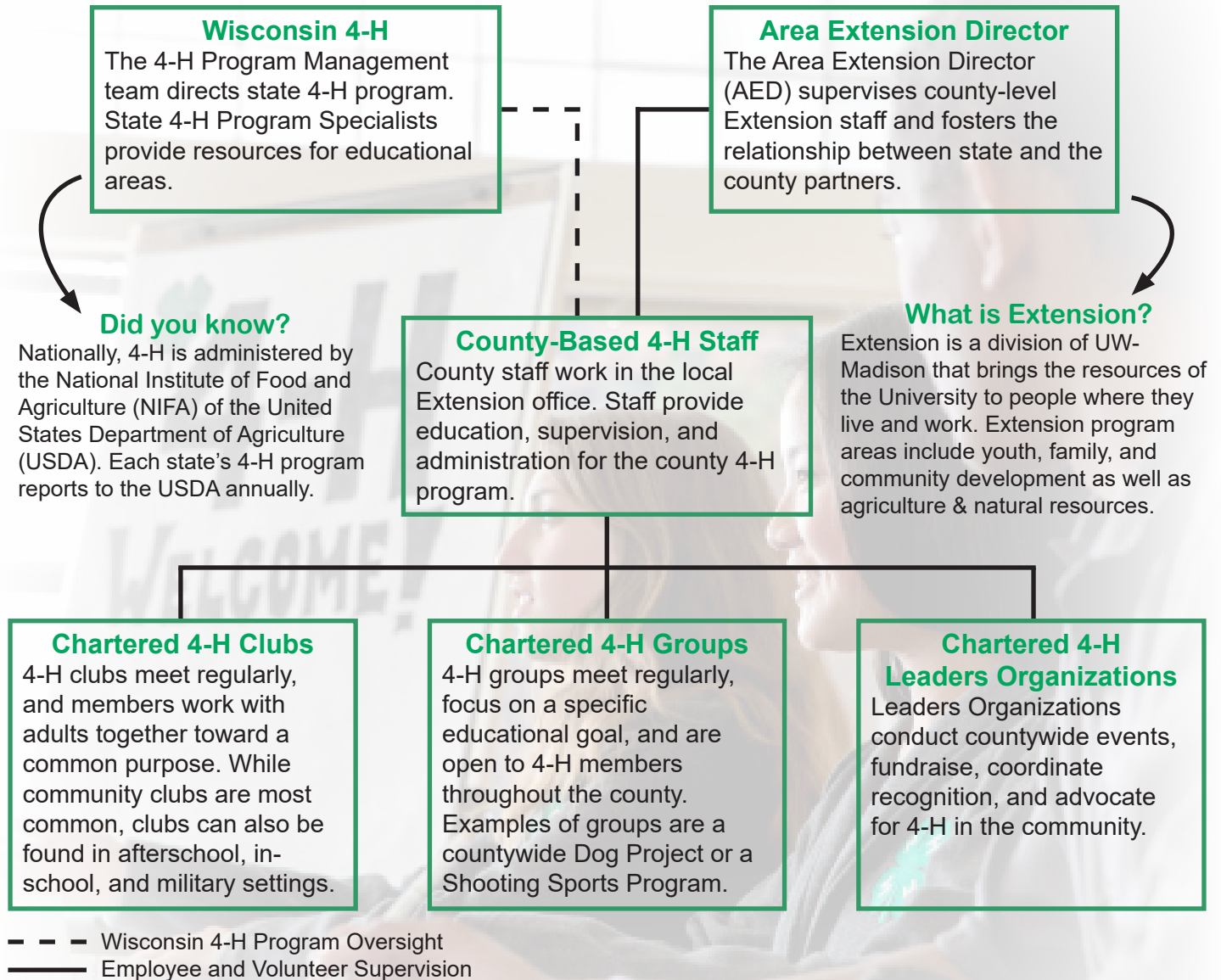

Beyond the Club

You're a part of something big! 4-H is the nation's largest youth development organization, with more than 6 million members and over 90,000 clubs. Because of how big 4-H is, it can be hard to understand where you (and everyone else) fits into the greater scope of 4-H from a state and national level.



Where do I fit?

Most members get their start with a 4-H club. If your child wants to get more involved with 4-H beyond the club level, check with your club leader or your county-based 4-H staff to learn about additional 4-H opportunities. Getting involved with your county's groups or the Leaders Organization can be great ways to connect with new opportunities.





YOUTH Matter!

Youth lead and make decisions in 4-H clubs, groups, and experiences. That means that the most important piece of 4-H is YOU. As a 4-H member, you help to make decisions and can make your voice heard.

You can help to lead and make decisions in 4-H. Each statement is a way that you can get involved. Decide if you think the statement shows how you can be involved in 4-H at the club, county, state, or national level. Circle where this might apply. Some statements might apply to more than one level of 4-H.
