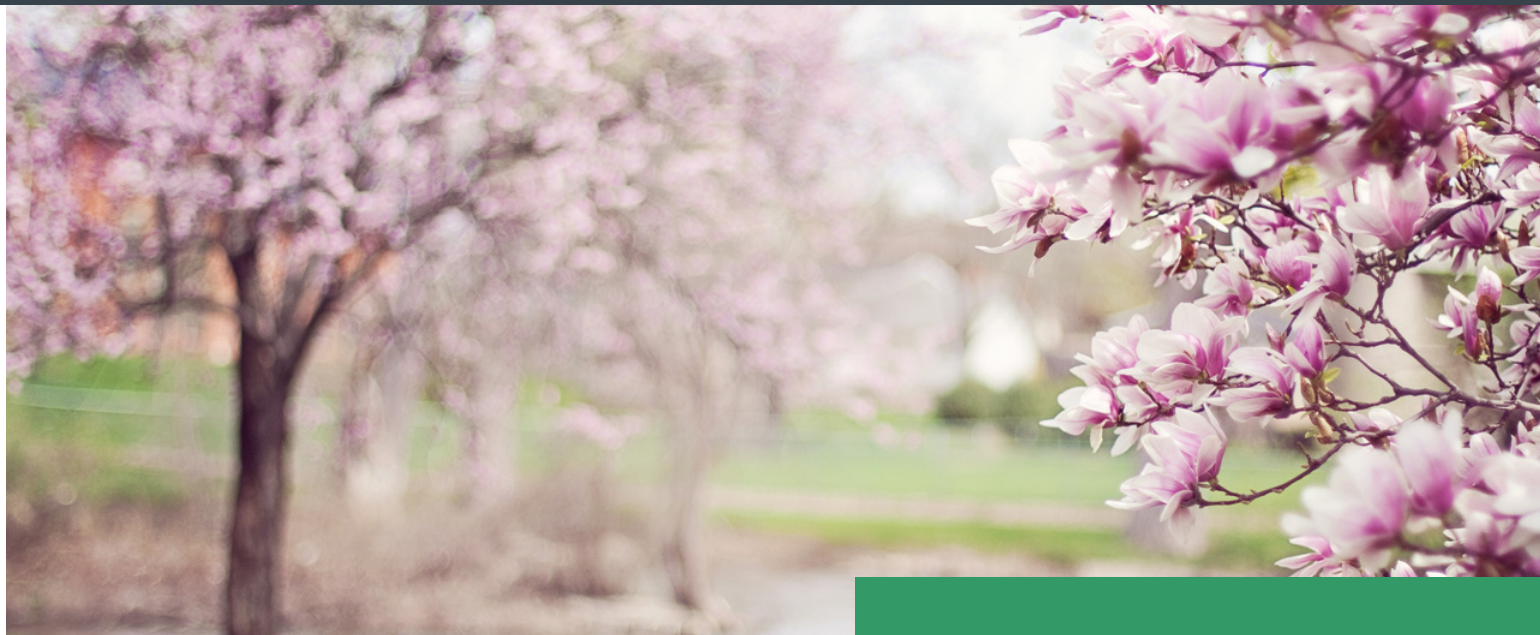

VIP Training

VIP or Volunteers in Preparation training is for anyone who wants to work with youth one-on-one and teach sessions like a project or club leader. If you have signed up to volunteer in 4-H Online and I have yet to approve you, it is because of this: You must complete either VIP (in-person Training), mandated reporter training (Online), or Title IX Training (Online).

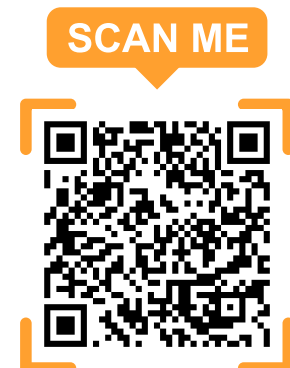
I will shift towards less pre-scheduled VIP training and more to working with your schedule. I am also willing to come to club meetings and train adults there! Please contact me if you are interested in scheduling a VIP training!

The mandated reporter is an online course in 4-H Online that you can complete over time. VIP, however, has to be taught by either myself or another educator virtually or in person. This training covers topics like creating a safe environment for youth, insurance, what to do in an emergency, and more. It takes about 90 minutes. I prefer to do VIP training on weeknights in September-May because the rest of the year gets pretty busy for everyone, especially in the summer. Want more information about VIPs? E-mail me! Explore your Sparks in art & STEM!

Join us for Weaving Patterns, Weaving Materials, and Weaving Light. We will have three virtual sessions on May 9, 16, & 23.

Register below.

Registration closes on April 27 (or when the maximum number of participants is reached.)

Sessions are aimed at those in 5th grade and up. Helloloom developed them! Creator and professor of design at UW-Madison, Marianne Fairbanks; UW-Madison STEM outreach specialist, Tom Zinnen; and 4-H Program Educator in Eau Claire County, Rachel Hart-Brinson. Each session will build on the previous one, but you will have access to a recording to watch the ones you may have missed.

Supplies will be sent to you or your County's Extension Office after registration closes on April 27.

Thanks to a Baldwin Grant, there is no cost for this program.

Session descriptions are below:

WEAVING PATTERNS

Learn how to weave using a small hand-held loom! You will learn how to weave with multiple colors, explore patterns, and create a fun and colorful woven creation!

We will begin with a quick paper weaving to learn new patterns, including plain weave, several twills, and basket weave. Students will learn the definition of warp and weft and how patterns make the weaving balanced, warp-faced, or weft-faced. Once you weave these patterns, you will notice them in woven garments and upholstery fabrics.

Ultimately students are encouraged to play with patterns and colors to see what combinations they can invent!

Trempealeau County Awards Now Open:

Do you know a 4-H Member or volunteer member who has impacted your 4-H experience? Here is your chance to recognize them! Below are descriptions of the awards Trempealeau County recognizes. If one of these descriptions reminds you of someone, you can nominate them at the link on the next page. Nominations close on **June 1st**.

- **Achievement Award** – Trempealeau County 4-H presents Achievement Awards to two experienced 4-H youth annually. This award is the second-highest honor a Trempealeau County 4-Her can receive. (The Key Award is the highest honor. To receive the Key Award, youth must submit an application in the Fall to the Parent and Leaders Association)
 - The Achievement Award is based on members' overall involvement, leadership, and accomplishments throughout their 4-H careers. The member must show significant involvement at the club and county levels to be selected for this award. District, state, and national experience is also a plus. Nominees should have served in youth leadership roles in a variety of ways.
 - While awards and recognitions received by the 4-Her are considered, they are not the primary focus in selecting Achievement Award recipients.
- **Friend of 4-H Award** – This award is given to a business, organization, or individual for being a "Friend of 4-H". They have helped 4-H members or the 4-H program to improve it.
- **Distinguished Service Award** – Any active 4-H group or individual may make a nomination for the Distinguished Service Award. Nominees must be active registered 4-H leaders and serve at least five years as Trempealeau County 4-H volunteers. Nominees should be adults who have made outstanding contributions to our program through their involvement and leadership in Trempealeau County 4-H.
- **Volunteer of the Year Award** – Any active 4-H group or individual may make a nomination for the Volunteer of the Year Award. Nominees must be active registered 4-H leaders and must have served at least four years or fewer as a Trempealeau County 4-H volunteer. Nominees should be adults who have made outstanding contributions to our program through their involvement and leadership in Trempealeau County 4-H.

- **James W. Crowley 4-H Dairy Leadership Award** – The James W. Crowley 4-H Dairy Leadership Award program recognizes youth who have excelled in their dairy project. The James W. Crowley Dairy Management and Extension Fund sponsors this award. We are pleased to name the award in honor and memory of James W. Crowley, longtime Extension Dairy Specialist and strong supporter of dairy youth projects. A unique engraved medallion will be presented to each county’s outstanding 4-H dairy project members for their accomplishments over the last year. The Crowley Fund provides these medallions. County Award winners are eligible to compete for 15 state-wide awards. State winners will receive plaques, and the top two youths in the state competition will each receive \$500 awards for continuing their dairy education.
 - **SELECTION** for Crowley Award:
 - Selection of the Leadership Award will be based on each county’s selection criteria. Possible criteria could include the evaluation of record books, selection by a county dairy committee/agent, or any other method the county deems appropriate.
 - **ELIGIBILITY** for Crowley Award:
 - Must be enrolled in the 4-H Dairy Project and have at least two previous years of membership.
 - Must be in 10th–12th grades as of January 1, 2023.
 - Should have an outstanding record of involvement and accomplishments in the 4-H Dairy Project. Must not have received a Crowley scholarship previously. Youth who received a plaque award only may re-apply for the scholarship if their county selects them as nominees for the state award.



2023 County 4-H Award Nominations

County Awards are announced and recognized at the Trempealeau County Fair each year. These awards include the following: Achievement Award, Friend of 4-H Award, Distinguished Service Award, Volunteer of the Year Award, and James W. Crowley 4-H Dairy Leadership Award. 2023 DOG OBEDIENCE CLASSES SET:

Dog Obedience Classes will be held in Trempealeau County this Spring. The County 4-H Dog Project Leaders offer classes for both 4-H Club members enrolled in the dog project and community members.

The Dog Obedience Informational Meeting WILL NOT be held this year. Signup will take place the first night of class. It will include a brief orientation session, registration (class paperwork - signup), a training demonstration, class summary information, required equipment, and dog health. You may purchase equipment on the first night of class. When arriving at class, do NOT let your dogs socialize with other dogs at class; dogs need to be 6 feet apart. We will get you signed up for class and fitted for equipment individually.

Weekly training sessions will be held in both Whitehall and Galesville. The Whitehall Classes will be held on Monday evenings at Larson Park (the park by the swimming pool) and in Galesville at the Fairgrounds on Thursday evenings. Whitehall will offer a beginner class on Monday evenings starting May 1st at 6:00 p.m. Beginner and Advanced Dog Obedience Classes will be held in Galesville. Galesville training classes will start on Thursday evening, May 4th at 6:00 p.m. at the Fairgrounds. Classes will be held weekly through the end of June. Agility classes will start later in May in Galesville on Thursday evenings. Agility times and dates will be determined after class participant interest is determined. Parental help with setup and takedown of equipment will be required! You must have completed an obedience class to participate in agility. Rally and Showmanship will also be offered in Galesville in June (times to be determined). Fair brush up the fun night will be held in Galesville at the Fairgrounds on Thursday, July 6th, 2023, at 6 pm. The training class fee for 4-H and FFA members will be \$25.00, and for the general public - community members will be \$60.00.

The equipment needed for the class will be a 6-Ft. leather or cotton web lead and a correctly sized nylon or chain training collar. The cotton web leads can be purchased at class; training collars are available in all sizes. Anyone participating in agility is required to have a buckle collar without any tags attached to the collar.

Please bring a copy of your current dog vaccination records with you to class the first night, copy to turn in, - we are required to keep a copy on file. All dogs must have current distemper, rabies, and parvovirus shots.
