

Club Leader Corner

Am I a volunteer Leader? :

Do you know if you are acting as a 4-H volunteer and need to start training to become a certified volunteer? Look at the decision chart below to help determine if you are acting in the role of a volunteer. If you answered yes to any of these questions you are on track to be a volunteer and should enroll as a volunteer in 4-H Online and start training.

Volunteer training has moved online and is available when you are. On pages 4 and 5 of the newsletter, there are lists of what training new volunteers and returning ones need to complete. The first step is enrolling in 4-H Online as all the trainings will be tracked but they are also available.



You are acting as a volunteer and need to become certified.

Some of you may be familiar with VIP (Volunteers in Preparation) the in-person training required to become a certified volunteer. It has been replaced with Grow Green. More information can be found on page 3. I am happy to answer any questions you may have about what volunteering means and what the requirements are.

Volunteer Training Updates:

Volunteers may remember participating in VIP (Volunteers in Preparation), and now we are shifting to a new version of orientation called “Grow Green.” This new, interactive orientation is available online or in a paper format to be read offline. It is designed to be taken whenever it is convenient for the potential new volunteer.

A little bit more about Grow Green:

- Offered online at this link: <https://4h.extension.wisc.edu/resources/volunteer-resources/training-for-volunteers/grow-green/> - click on the green “Start the Training” button to begin
- Two short, interactive modules - one module is an introduction to volunteering in Extension and Wisconsin 4-H, and a second module is geared towards a specific volunteer role. Combined, this orientation should take around 45 minutes to complete.
- Lots of practical tips - in the training modules, new volunteers will learn about some of the 4-H guiding principles (Essential Elements, Life Skills Development, Ages and stages of Youth) and gain some really practical tips to use as a volunteer.
- Start and stop at your leisure - if you start the training and need to step away, you can come back to the website using the same device you started with and it will pick up where you left off.

We are hopeful that this will make orientation more convenient and beneficial! This orientation is required for new volunteers, but it is available online for all volunteers to take as a refresher.

Thank you to our volunteers for mentoring and supporting the youth in 4-H!



2024 Livestock Requirements:

Please see the Livestock information below.
Hello Livestock Exhibitors,

Welcome to the 2024 Jackson County Livestock Show season!

We know there is a lot of information that makes the Jackson County Livestock project a success, and because of that, we wanted to make sure everyone received the same information to start this year off strong. If you have any questions that are not answered below, please let us know!

1. **TWO EDUCATIONAL WORKSHOPS** will be required for 2024. The 2024 Workshop Guidelines can be found on the JCFair website at <https://www.jacksoncountyfairwi.com/>
2. This year YQCA is NOT REQUIRED to show at the Jackson County Fair, however, anyone who is planning on showing at the Wisconsin State Fair will still need to complete YQCA.
3. This year we will be doing **FAMILY REGISTRATION**. Each exhibitor can still weigh in/register 4 animals but show 3 at the fair (of each species). Before unloading your animals at the fair, you must provide the department superintendent with the Animal ID form (and all other required paperwork) listing which animals belong to which exhibitor of a family. (Example: Family of 3 may register up to 12 beef, but may only bring 9 to the fair. Before unloading at the fair, the department superintendent must be provided with three Animal ID forms specifying which exhibitor is showing which beef. One ID form per exhibitor.) Once an animal has been checked in by the Superintendent & Animal ID forms have been collected, transfer/trading of animals between family members is prohibited. Double-check your Animal ID forms to make sure all are correct.
4. All Livestock properties must hold a **PREMISE ID**, this is something that you will need to provide on Fair entries. If you need to register for a Premise ID visit, https://datcp.wi.gov/Pages/Programs_Services/PremisesRegistration.aspx
4. We will have a **TAG HANDOUT FOR PIGS, SHEEP, AND GOATS** on April 27th. The registration forms for these species can be found on the fair website and were attached to the orientation email. If your animal that already has an 840 tag, we can use that tag for our identification purposes, please include that 840 number on your registration paper.

5. The **SWINE SHOW WILL AGAIN BE BROKEN DOWN INTO A BARROW & A GILT SHOW**. This means that we will have a Grand Champion Barrow, Reserve Champion Barrow, Grand Champion Gilt & Reserve Champion Gilt. We will again have Bred & Owned Gilt as well as Bred & Owned Barrow. If you have any questions related to this please talk to Dan Anderson, Swine Superintendent.

6. At the end of the year we will hold our **LIVESTOCK STOCKS AUCTION**, to earn points for these stocks you will need to attend the different workshops in person (and sign in on the sign-in sheet). Points will be turned into fun money that will be able to buy NEW items that could be used for your project.

7. **NEW THIS YEAR**, we will be holding **LIVESTOCK OPEN FORUMS**. Instead of Education Committee meetings every other month, we will be having Open Forums three times a year. The first open forum was held on March 13 and was very successful! The remaining Open Forums will be on September 11 and November 13 all starting at 6:30 PM and will be held at the Black River Falls High School Commons Area. At the Open Forums, the Livestock Superintendents will give 3-4 different subjects for the group to discuss in 15-20 minute blocks. We would like to see the Open Forums last about 1 hour. There will be two adult volunteers who will lead the forum, facilitate discussion, and keep things on track. The facilitators will take notes and report back to the Superintendents with your ideas, suggestions, or questions. The forums are open to everyone, any age is welcome. Livestock Exhibitors will earn Livestock Stock points for coming to the forums. The forums will not count as an educational workshop.

Trempealeau County Ag Society—what is that?

If you are new to 4-H or have been a member for many years you may have this question. The Trempealeau County Ag Society is the host of the County Fair! They are commonly known as the “Fair Board.”

Who is on the “Fair Board”? The Fair Board is made up of individuals elected to three-year terms at their annual meeting in November of each year. It is a VOLUNTEER position and these volunteers have a deep passion for cultivating and sustaining the county fair experience.

What does the “Fair Board” do? They meet every month to make decisions regarding the fairgrounds property and how to keep the fairgrounds neat, well-maintained, and growing for the next generation. They put in many hours planning for the annual fair including setting guidelines for exhibiting, securing fair entertainment, and planning for the annual fair to make it a success. They partner with businesses and individuals in the county to secure funding to provide the wonderful opportunities the county fair provides. In June and July, they put in many additional hours at the grounds, making sure things get done in advance of the fair. And during the fair, they wear colored T-shirts so you know who they are. They love to have you ask “How can I help?” It “takes a village” to put on the fair and they are very grateful for the tremendous support of volunteers, such as Project Superintendents, 4-H members and leaders who help clean up before and AFTER the fair, the judging assistants, the livestock auction committee volunteers and everyone who comes together to make the fair successful. The Trempealeau County Fair has been a highlight of the summer for many, many years. 2024 will be the 166th Annual County Fair—Wow!

Who exhibits at the county fair? The 4-H program is just one of the organizations that exhibit at the fair. Others include FFA, Boy Scout, and Girl Scout groups as well as any organization that requests, in writing, that they wish to exhibit at the fair and get approval from the Fair Board. In addition, you can exhibit in the Open Class departments if you are not involved with a Youth program or are an adult (lots of former 4-H’rs continue to exhibit as adults).


RABBIT PROJECT FAir Reminder:
