National Volunteer Week Salutes 4-H Volunteers in Jackson County

UW Madison Division of Extension — Jackson County is proud to celebrate Volunteer Appreciation Week, April 20-26, 2025, a time to honor the devoted individuals who generously give their time and talent to support Jackson County 4-H.

Jackson County 4-H relies heavily on volunteers in the 4-H program. This year, (total number) volunteers have served as 4-H club leaders, project leaders, 4-H Council members and various other volunteer roles.

4-H Volunteers are truly integral for creating intentional and positive experiences for youth statewide. Their volunteer efforts enable youth to improve decision making skills, build leadership skills and help prepare youth to be ready for future careers. 4-H volunteers essential to helping youth find their spark.

According to the 2024 North Central Region Volunteer Impact Study, Wisconsin 4-H volunteers spend an average of nine hours per week supporting local 4-H experiences. Examples of their efforts include organizing 4-H club meetings, leading 4-H project experiences, leading a community service project, preparing youth for a judging contest and many other tasks.

The work of Wisconsin 4-H volunteers is continuous. Every day a volunteer is ensuring 4-H experiences are available to youth in Jackson County. These experiences are essential not only to youth experiencing positive relationships with a caring adult, but also to making communities stronger.

4-H Project Grant Application

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4-H project grants are available to any and all Jackson County 4-H projects (countywide basis) that would like to apply. **Applications must be written and submitted to the 4-H Executive Board by April 30th.** Proposals must follow the format provided on pages 2-3. They will be reviewed at the May 4-H Executive Board meeting in preparation for the next year's budget/funding cycle.

Only one grant per project will be awarded. (This means projects are responsible for gathering leaders and youth on a countywide basis to ensure one proposal per project.)

Proposals should have an educational purpose. Examples include but are not limited to: equipment, field trips, camp, group learning session, volunteer development.

Please email the Parent and Leaders Board with any question at: jacksonleadersboard@gmail.com.

Applications must include:

1. Name(s) of those who wrote the proposal.
 2. Summary of the use of the funds requested. What educational activities for youth will be supported with the money?
 3. Why are the funds being requested?
 4. How will the funds benefit the entire project?
 5. Itemized budget for how the money will be spent; including the total amount of funding requested.
 6. What other fundraising efforts has the project already done and what fundraising does it plan to do in the future?
 7. Who will oversee the money if it is awarded? (Overseer must be a certified 4-H adult leader)
- Signature of one certified 4-H adult leader.

Reporting Requirements:

Recipient groups must report back about the activities supported by the grant funds before the end of the fiscal year. The report will take the form of a short (5-minute) presentation responding to the following questions:

What was your proposal? What were you hoping to accomplish?

Who were your partners?

What unexpected things happened?

Did you accomplish what you intended? How do you know? Do you have any data you can share?

What are the next steps? How will you keep the momentum going?
